Join us and see Kosovo through our eyes.

GoKosovo aims to showcase every single corner of Kosovo — each one a hidden gem. During this journey, you will explore national parks, cities, and enjoy different kinds of outdoor activities every day. Discover Kosovo with us: hike through national parks, explore caves, and climb various gorges.

Day 1

Arrival: You will arrive at Prishtina Airport, where our team will pick you up and transfer you to the city of Prizren.

14:00 - Check-in:

After check-in, our guide will meet you for a Prizren city tour, which will last until around 15:30.

16:00 – Via Ferrata Panorama:

At 16:00, another guide will pick you up for the Via Ferrata Panorama adventure. After the activity, we'll enjoy dinner together as a group.

Day 2 – Sharr Mountains: Hike to Jazhinca Lake

Hiking to Jazhinca Lake is a beautiful and relatively easy day trip. Most of the trail passes through scenic forest areas. After approximately 2.6 km, you'll need to cross a small but deep river—so be prepared to take off your shoes and walk through cold water.

At the 7 km mark, there's a 1.3 km section with rocky terrain. Once you reach the lake, the view is stunning. Surrounded by the magnificent Sharr Mountains, this glacial lake sits beneath the peak of Bistra (2,651 m). The water is very cold, but swimming is possible for those who dare! The lake has a heart shape, which is best seen from a rock located about 50 meters above.

This trail is beautiful in all seasons, especially in early summer. There are many natural water sources along the way, so bringing around 1 liter of water is sufficient.

The trail is clearly marked with signs, and the path is easy to follow throughout the hike.

The Mirusha River has formed 13 small lakes connected by a series of beautiful waterfalls. The highest waterfall, located between the sixth and seventh lakes, is 22 meters tall. The area is rich in biodiversity, home to a wide variety of plant and animal species. The region is primarily forested with Hungarian oaks. In total, 330 vascular plant species have been identified in the Mirusha Conservation Area, in addition to mosses, lichens, and 44 species of large mushrooms.

Wildlife sightings in the area include wild boars, European badgers, brown hares, squirrels, wolves, wildcats, pine martens, muskrats, yellow-necked mice, southern white-breasted hedgehogs, Greek tortoises, and European horned vipers. The Mirusha River also provides excellent conditions for amphibians and fish.

Adventure Activity – Climbing the Mirusha Gorge

After a 1 km hike, you will arrive at the waterfalls. This is a fun and scenic climb where Via Ferrata equipment is used for safety. You will be surrounded by waterfalls and rocky landscapes throughout the adventure. After climbing, you may choose to take a swim. During this visit to Mirusha National Park, you will see 4–5 waterfalls, and possibly more. The entire activity lasts approximately 1.5 to 2 hours.

Gjakova City Tour

After the adventure in Mirusha, we'll drive to Gjakova for a lunch break. Following lunch, a local guide will lead a tour of the historic city.

Kusar Cave

We will then visit Kusar Cave, where you'll have about 30 minutes of free time to explore and take pictures. The area contains two cave sites located deep within the rocks, featuring layers of soil, stone, and soot. Archaeological findings include fragments of prehistoric pottery and antique bricks, indicating that the caves were inhabited during the Eneolithic Period. After visiting Kusar Cave, we will drive to the city of Peja.

Day 4 - Hiking to Rrugova Lakes


After breakfast, get ready for an unforgettable adventure!

If this is your first time here, you'll be amazed by the crystal-clear blue waters of the two stunning mountain lakes. If you're looking for a relaxed mountain hike surrounded by breathtaking nature, this trail is a must.

The hike begins in the village of Kuqishtë, where you follow a quiet road leading to the village of Leqinat. For about one hour, you'll walk along an asphalt road through beautiful deciduous and coniferous forests until you reach Restaurant Leqinat. From there, a forest trail winds upward along a rock wall toward Lake Leqinat.

Once you reach the lake, you can either take a peaceful break or continue on to the second, smaller lake if the area is crowded. As you descend toward the second lake, you leave the Peaks of the Balkans Trail and follow a smaller path downhill. Although it's poorly signposted, the route is straightforward with no intersections to confuse your direction. Eventually, you'll reach a forest road (currently being converted to asphalt), which you follow back down into the Rugova Gorge.





Day 5 – Village Cave Trekking & Via Ferrata Shpellat

Cave Trekking – Sleeping Beauty Cave

Explore the hidden underground world of Kosovo's karst landscape with a unique cave trekking experience. The Sleeping Beauty Cave, stretching 3,650 meters, is the second-largest cave in Kosovo and home to eight different species of bats. It is located near the largest waterfall in the Balkans and the White Drin river spring.

Perfect for those seeking peace, silence, and recreation, this guided experience is ideal for small groups and takes you through sections of the cave not accessible to the general public. No previous experience is required. A professional guide and necessary equipment (helmet and headlamp) will be provided. This is a great opportunity to bond with friends while sharing an unforgettable adventure.

- · Experience level: No prior experience needed

White Drin Waterfall (Drini i Bardhë)

One of Kosovo's most spectacular natural attractions, the White Drin Waterfall is a must-see. It originates from the Radac Cave, at the base of Mount Rusolia, at an elevation of 586 m. The spring creates a stunning 30-meter-high waterfall that flows into the Drin River, which stretches 122 km through Kosovo and gathers waters from the Lumbardh of Peja, Erenik, and Lumbardh of Prizren. The Drin Basin, covering 4,646 km², is the largest of Kosovo's four watersheds.

Via Ferrata Shpellat – Rugova Gorge Adventure

For adrenaline lovers, Via Ferrata Shpellat offers an epic adventure through the cliffs and caves of Rugova Gorge. Starting from the Tibetan Bridge, the route initially follows the Via Ferrata Ari before branching right. You'll climb metal stairs fixed to the cliffs and pass through seven cave-like openings along a 470-meter secured trail equipped with steel cables.

Constructed in 2020, this exciting via ferrata lets you enjoy breathtaking views, take incredible photos, and rest at scenic cave stops along the way.

- · Duration: 2.5 to 3 hours
- · Difficulty: Moderate to challenging
- · Highlights: Tibetan Bridge, cliff stairs, panoramic views of Rugova Gorge

Day 6 - Gjeravica Peak Hike

As summer awakens the mountains, Gjeravica Peak reveals a unique and breathtaking beauty. The trail takes you through picturesque landscapes, dotted with blooming wildflowers and lush green meadows. Along the way, you'll pass Gropa e Erenikut and the serene Gjeravica Lake, where peace and quiet embrace you before your final ascent.

From the summit, you'll be rewarded with panoramic views that stretch endlessly across the rugged wilderness of western Kosovo. It's a full-day hike perfect for nature lovers and adventure seekers looking to experience one of Kosovo's most iconic mountain peaks.

About Gjeravica

Gjeravica is one of the most stunning mountains in the region and the second-highest peak in the Albanian Alps. It stands as a top attraction and a must-do experience when visiting Kosovo.

On clear days, hikers are rewarded with breathtaking views of the Dukagjini Plain and the vast Accursed Mountains (Bjeshkët e Nemuna). The area is dotted with glacial lakes, with the largest—Gjeravica Lake—located on the southwestern side of the summit at approximately 2,300 meters above sea level. This lake is also the source of the Erenik River.

The Gjeravica region is also well-known for its wild chestnuts and blueberries, offering a taste of the mountain's natural richness.

· Highest Point: Gjeravica Summit (2,656 m)

· Estimated Duration: Full-day hike (~7-8 hours round trip)
